What's now in Flanders?

- [before 2014-2015] Level 5 < Centers for Adult Education
- [since 2014-2015] Level 5 < Centers for Adult Education in cooperation with university colleges
- 14 consortiums in Flanders



What's now in Flanders?

- Level 5
 - 54 programs in 5 study areas
 - Approximately 14.000 students
 - Mainly part-time students
 - Mainly employees and job seekers
 - Few students straight from secondary schools
 - ▶ Level ≠ well-known
 - Important differences vis-a-vis level 6 or 7 (e.g. no study allowance)



What's now in AP?

- Consortium
 - AP + 5 Centers for Adult Education
 - 3 locations: Antwerp, Malines and Turnhout
 - 19 active programs + 5 sleeping programs in 5 study areas
 - 3097 students (2016-2017)



What's next?



What's next in Flanders?

- 1 September 2019: integration level 5 in university colleges
- Democratization of higher education
- Strong and distinct profile with clear brand awareness
- Dual objectives:
 - Qualified outflow to labor market
 - Progress to level 6
- Dual target group:
 - "Current" target group of nontraditional higher education students
 - "New" target group of traditional higher education students



What's next in Flanders?

- Before 1 September 2019
 - Conversion of the existing level 5-programs:
 - Based on the needs of the labor market (vocational qualifications)
 - 90 or 120 ECTS-credits
 - Work-based learning (1/3)

VQ EQ LO Assessment



Conversion

- Vocational qualification(s) (VQ) < sector + AHOVOKS
 - Description of activities employees (with reference to knowledge and skills, context, autonomy and responsibility)
- Validation, classification and ratification VQ
- VQ = level 5? > development educational qualification (EQ) level 5 < AHOVOKS
- Development learning outcomes (LO) < consortiums

VQ EQ LO Assessment

Conversion

- Assessment < consortium
 - Description of the quality of the program on the basis of 4 standards:
 - Intended learning outcomes
 - Learning environment (curriculum, staff, infrastructure, ...)
 - Attained learning outcomes
 - Internal quality assurance
- Judgement < Accreditation Organisation of the Netherlands and Flanders (NVAO)
- Start program in September 2019

Challenges!



Challenges: change management!

- Process of change management
 - New organisation culture
 - New employment agreement
 - New locations
 - New programs (learning outcomes, work-based learning, etc.)
 - New target groups

- ...



Challenge: recognition!

- Recognition of level 5
 - Full-fledged level of higher education
 - Strong and distinct profile (≠ level 6)
 - Associate's degree in competency dictionaries/models, vacancies, ...
 - > Adapted wage scales for associate's degree



Challenge: adaptation to the labor market!

- Via vocational qualification(s)
 - Ongoing dialogue with regard to the update of the learning outcomes and the programs
 - Active participation in (the building of) the programs



Challenge: work-based learning!

- For all students
- For all target groups
- Early in the program, in a combination of learning and working
- Supported by experienced mentors
 - Create job trainings / workplaces
 - Develop a vision on learning and working
 - > Facilitate nontraditional students
 - > Train mentors
