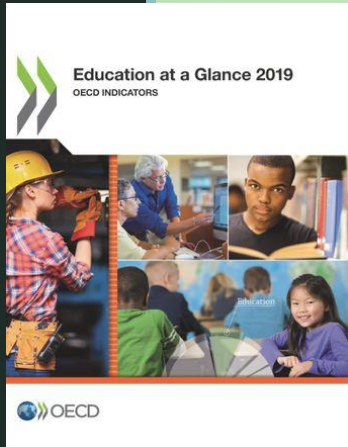

Why this Workshop ?

- - **Education at a Glance 2019** *OECD Indicators*
- French profile
- "Students enrolled in short-cycle tertiary programmes (DUT and BTS) are more likely to complete their qualifications than students enrolled in a bachelor's programme in France (completion rate of 61% compared to 41%) and than students in other OECD countries."



Our concern

Current success and political orientation

So far : Level 5 programmes are recognised as one of the best choice by students, families and companies.

Now : Politics change the L5 programme landscape to guide L4 VET candidates to only one L5 path : BTS.
no more L5 at university (no more DUT)

Overview of L5 in France

- Part of the educational landscape since the 60s and no changes with bologna process.
- 3 main paths DUT, BTS and CERTIFICATES (Rncp)
- Importance of the individual mentoring at institution level
- Strong relationship with the labour market in the programme design.
- Selective recrutement.
- Access to L6-professional bachelor.

French political orientation

- DUT :
2-year Dut + 1 top year are merged in a 3-year L6
Quotas to favor the recruitment of candidates with technological background.
- BTS :
Quotas to favor the recruitment of candidates with vocational background.
Widening apprenticeship offer

Our concern

- No more L5 at University ? (DUT)
- Quotas can build "ghettos" (BTS)
- Apprenticeship as a positive path , (pedagogical approach – cost transfered to companies)
- More CERTIFICATES ?
