

Education and Training in Ireland

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Education Sectors

- Schools
 - Early years care and education
 - generally private, subsidised, but expensive, recently developed
 - Primary 4-12 years
 - >90% church-linked
 - Post-primary 13-18
 - Public exams, 15, 18
 - Largely academic
- Funded by Department of Education and Skills
- Quality assured by Inspectorate

- Further Education and Training
 - Initial and continuing VET and adult/community education
 - Mainly public, funded by SOLAS
- Higher education
 - Universities
 - Institutes of technology
 - Specialist colleges
 - Mainly public, funded by HEA
- Quality assured by QQI



- 16 ETBs established in 2013
- merged from previous bodies (VECs & FÁS)
- manage small number of primary schools
- manage 1/3 of second level schools
- manage almost all post-second level FET
- in FE colleges, training centres, adult & community centres, prisons, Youthreach (early school leavers), etc
- regulated & funded by FET authority SOLAS
- 339k beneficiaries
- 22k FET programmes
- €638m investment
- external quality assurance by QQI (for FET)



FET providers (non-ETB)

- Approximately 500 but consolidating
- Many small-scale or specialist
- Almost 50% of QQI qualifications awarded, but many minor awards
- Public and privately funded
- Initial and continuing VET and adult ed.
- Some linked/sub-contracting to ETBs
- Challenging to QQI model of provider-owned QA
- Waiting in the wings English language schools





AWARDS IN THE FRAMEWORK

There are four classes of award in the National Framework of Qualifications:



Major Awards: named in the outer rings, are the principal class of awards made at a level

Minor Awards: are for partial completion of the outcomes for a Major Award



Special Purpose Awards: are for relatively narrow or purpose-specific achievement



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
