used in 46 countries, 650 training schools




referred in CEN and ISO Standards

Requirements for Certification

- 1. Technical Knowledge Requirement IIW/EWF Diploma
 - 2. Two Years Recent Experience Relevant Job Content and Level
 - 3. Demonstration of Maintaining and Developing Technical Knowledge

4. ANB¹ Assessment

5. Issue of Certificate (Renewed Every 3 years by Repeating Steps 2,3 and 4 Above - "Surveillance")

Rules/Requirements for Authorised Nominated Bodies (ANBs) Rules/Requirements for Authorised Training Bodies (ATBs)

Harmonised Assessors Training and Peer Review



Statements

Social partners, involved in the development of the EQF and in its Advisory Board for this instrument, need to have a formal link with an international platform with representatives of international networks (associations) for international certificates and diplomas (based on international qualifications).

There is a need for a European Qualifications Framework for non-formal learning, with descriptors based on standards that are used by 'the world of work', like ISO and CEN – and with a 'conversion table' of this EQF-NF with the EQF for LLL.

Enhancement of VET providers and Universities collaboration is mandatory, by developing joint qualifications.
