Exploring the Challenges of Permeability: EQF-5 and Higher Levels (Higher Education and Higher VET)

Paving the way for flexible learning pathways and the role of the labour market

KEY-ISSUES FOR THIS CONFERENCE

- How can qualifications be linked to each other for permeability between the two sectors, at the levels 5 and higher of the EQF (and the national frameworks):
 - Higher Education
 - Vocational Education (Vocational and Professional Education also known as Higher VET)?
- How can we promote cooperation for learning pathways where institutions from those different sectors are involved, and how can they be filled in correctly?
- What is the role of the business community in promoting flexible learning pathways that are making use of both sectors?
- Is there a strong need for 'international common names' for qualifications in both sectors, to make the whole system for level 5 and higher levels more transparent for the stakeholders?
- Can common guidelines be drawn up for a stronger approach to permeability procedures between the two sectors, to the benefit of students and adult learners?
- What can be the role of the international associations and networks for both sectors, to initiate a process for this, and who can contribute to such an initiative?

In the previous newsletter, we informed you about the initiative of EfVET and CHAIN5 to host a unique forum. That's why the purpose of the conference is to examine, based on recent developments around the EQF, the European Higher Education Area, the growing importance of Higher VET (Vocational and Professional Education) and how more flexible learning pathways are possible. This involves the use of qualifications from the various sectors (and the forms in which they can be offered). The role of qualifications at level 5, strongly emerging, can be looked at in this context to build a bridge from level 4 to higher levels.

In all this process the key point is the collaboration among institutions to reach "new" forms of permeability. There are a lot of opportunities, given the need for lifelong learning programmes and the demand for highly qualified people from the labor market.

If you would like to be part of the future of HVET, and explore the challenges of permeability by using all kind of gualifications at levels 5 and higher of the EQF', this conference is for you.

On the 9th and 10th of December we will come together to share examples and best practices and further explore what we can learn from all these experiences. The Conference will have a strong international representation with experts, institutions, quality assurance staff, managers, policy makers, networks, associations and representatives of national governments. This will offer you the opportunity to learn from professionals in the field and to widen your network.

The conference will lead to recommendations and the set up of an action plan, considering who wants to contribute in the coming period to 'the challenges of permeability by using all kind of qualifications at levels 5 and higher of the EQF'.

This event will be highly interactive including panel discussions, parallel sessions and workshops. Like previous years, the event will gather international experts, policymakers, colleges and quality assurance managers, delegates from different HVET and VET networks and national governments representatives.
