# After finishing level 4, students in the Netherlands can choose between Level 5 and 6

#### Associate degree

- EQF level 5
- 2 year higher education programme
- Practice-based and workbased learning / placement / graduation
- Full-time: focused on direct labour market entry
- Part-time/dual: focused on upskilling, professional development, or reskilling.

#### **Bachelor**

- EQF level 6
- 4 year higher education programme
- Year 1 and 2: practice & foundational skills
- Year 3: internship / specialisation
- Year 4: minor and graduation



#### Transition level 5 to level 6

After finishing a level 5 programme, students can get their bachelor degree in 2 years (120 EC) at a **strong related** bachelor:


- Legal obligation of effort for both Ad and Bachelor: "The institutions shall take care to ensure that the Associate degree graduate who opts for the higher education bachelor programme can complete the remaining part of the programme in the most efficient way possible, preferably within a shortened period." (Act Associate degree, 2018\_
- University's Board of Examiners gives grants exemptions in bachelor's programs for credits earned in associate degree programs.
- Partly or not related Ad-bachelor: more than 120 EC transition programme




## **Studying Logistics @BUas**

#### **Logistics Management**



The focus is on the business side of logistics. You will learn about entrepreneurship, change management and collaboration with customers and suppliers.

#### **Logistics Engineering**





The focus is on the technical and digital side of logistics. Automation and robotization of activities within the company.



#### Good practice: Ad to Bachelor Logistics transfer programme

#### Bridging the gap

- Ad graduates excel in practical skills through work placements but require development in research and analytical competences.
- Transfer students enter Year 2, where they build these foundational skills whilst skipping the Year 3 placement.


## 2 years Bachelor study programme for Ad graduates

Employment or follow-up study

Knowledge base Logistics (for everyone)

Practical experience (CIR, placement, graduation internship)

Specialisation/choices
(amongst others Logistics
Management or Engineering)





#### Good practice: Ad to Bachelor Logistics transfer programme


#### Strategic collaboration

Annual programme alignment meetings between Ad institutions and BUas (including counselor oversight) to:

- Compare learning outcomes
- Maintain curriculum coherence
- Identify any necessary adjustments.



## Learning outcomes Ad and BUas ba Logistics



Logistics Engineering (LE) and Logistics Management (LM)



#### Good practice: Ad to Bachelor Logistics transfer programme

#### Tailored Support

A dedicated mentor provides intensive support during initial weeks. To date, Ad graduates demonstrate success rates comparable to traditional students.

#### Student profile

Transfer students are typically slightly older, highly motivated, and goal-oriented, aiming to complete the bachelor in two years. Their self-sufficiency and work experience contribute to their success.

#### Smooth transition

A two-day pre-start programme helps students with the BUas environment, ways of working, and fellow students, enabling them to participate effectively from the start.
